Flooding on 25th/26th July

- Many areas in Dublin City were flooded on the above dates, including the part of St. Anne's Estate facing onto the Howth Road at the front of the estate. I know that several residents had to go out themselves and unblock the shores which had not been cleared in a long time.
- Following this incident I lodged a request with Dublin City Council that the shores in this area be cleared out. This work took place on the 1st August.
- As Main Street in the Village was also badly hit (again), with flooding from the Santry River, I will be continuing to campaign for the long-promised works to throttle back the river at Harmonstown Road and I will keep residents updated. The delay is not acceptable and residents deserve to see action in the near future.
- If there were any other flooding "blackspots" within the Ennafort estate please let me know and I will arrange for similar work to take place.
